# EL/LOS TEMA/S DEL CALL

CAPACITY BUILDING. CB Projects are transnational cooperation projects based on multilateral partnerships primarily between higher education institutions (HEIs) from Programme and eligible PCs financed through the above mentioned instruments. Through structured cooperation, exchange of experience and good practices and individuals' mobility, CB Projects aim to:

support the modernisation, accessibility and internationalisation of the higher education field in the eligible Partner Countries;

support eligible Partner Countries to address the challenges facing their higher education institutions and systems, including those of quality, relevance, equity of access, planning, delivery, management, governance;

contribute to cooperation between the EU and the eligible Partner Countries (and amongst the eligible Partner Countries);

promote voluntary convergence with EU developments in higher education; promote people to people contacts, intercultural awareness and understanding.





- Learning and teaching tools, methologies and pedagogical approaches including learning outcomes and ICT – based practices (inter alia, flexible learning paths, blended courses, virtual and real mobility, practical placements etc.)
- Multidisciplinarity / Interdisciplinarity.


